New State of the Art Medical Center in East Orlando

Grand Opening Gala and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

The development of South East Orlando's Medical City is staggering - two new hospitals, a research center, a proposed Dental College and the introduction of a wealth of new medical facilities and resources to support them.

This month's anticipated grand opening gala and ribbon cutting for the [Digestive and Liver Center of Florida's](#) (DLCFL) new 30,000 sq ft, state of the art medical facility, located at 100 North Dean Road, between the 408 and Lake Underhill Road, marked the end of a three year building process in East Orlando."

[Dr. Srinivas Seela, Dr. Harinath Sheela and Dr. Seela Ramesh](#) started seeing patients in their first floor suite in early May. The center treats patients for a variety of gastrointestinal disorders, liver diseases and pancreatobiliary disorders. They also offer advanced diagnostic and therapeutic endoscopy, colorectal cancer screening, pre and post liver transplant evaluation and a variety of other cutting edge procedures, including endoscopic ultrasound. Later this year, the state of the art surgery center is scheduled for completion to begin helping patients with the management, treatment and healing of their digestive and liver related surgical health issues. "Every aspect of the building design was scrutinized by us to ensure patients feel at ease the minute they walk through the doors." says Dr. Sheela

The grand opening gala was held on Wednesday, May 18th on the second floor of the new building and was organized by local event planning firm, [Posh Able Events](#). The event was well attended by local area officials, doctors, medical staff, patients and community leaders. The complete transformation of an un-finished 4,000 square foot portion of the building into a sophisticated and globally inspired event space was accomplished in less than four hours. According to owner of Posh Able Events, Paula Wyatt, "We started from literally nothing, we brought in the air conditioning, the furniture, the lighting, the greenery, everything!" The event featured live entertainment, south-beach inspired décor, magician, caricature artist and food from three different regions of the world. The East Orlando Chamber of Commerce and financing partner Fifth Third Bank were on site for the ribbon cutting.
